

## EDUCATING HAWAII'S YOUTH ABOUT HIV AND AIDS

More than half of new HIV infections occur in people under the age of 25, making youth a priority in the world-wide fight against the spread of HIV and AIDS.

According to CDC's Youth Risk Behavioral Survey, many young people begin having sexual intercourse at early ages: 47 percent of high school students have had sexual intercourse, and 7.4 percent of them reported first sexual intercourse before age 13.

HIV/AIDS education needs to take place at correspondingly young ages, before young people engage in sexual behaviors that put them at risk for HIV infection. Here in Hawaii, Life Foundation is proud to have started school-based AIDS education in the 1980s.

Since then, the organization has spoken to thousands of middle and high school students about the disease, educating them on how to protect themselves through healthy choices.

Life Foundation also runs a support group for young gay and bisexual men called MANA, providing a safe social alternative

# FIGHTING AIDS BEYOND OUR ISLAND

While the majority of Life Foundation's services and programs happen right here on Oahu, Life Foundation also strives to share its experience and lessons learned with AIDS organizations on the neighbor islands, mainland and Pacific Islands. Here are some highlights of this work over the past few months:

**Increasing Cultural Competency for Working with Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islander Populations, San Francisco, CA** – A 2 ½ hour training was conducted at the request of Asian and Pacific Islander Wellness Center to increase their prevention and care efforts for high-risk and HIV-positive Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islanders in the Bay Area. Life Foundation provided education, insight and basic skills in counseling, program design and cultural approaches when working with Pacific Islanders.

**Site Visit and Technical Consultation, Pago Pago, American Samoa** – Life Foundation participated in a site

visit of American Samoa's HIV programs funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Life Foundation also was invited to participate in the *Regional Technical Consultation on HIV Testing for the Pacific*, sponsored by the Secretariat of Pacific Communities.

This groundbreaking meeting gathered the input of major Pacific funders to collectively determine a standard of HIV diagnosis in the Pacific. Life Foundation played a key role in providing its experience as an NGO conducting HIV rapid testing in a Pacific Island community.

**The Fundamentals of HIV Counseling and Testing, Ebeye, Republic of the Marshall Islands** – Life Foundation conducted the first ever Counseling, Testing and Referral (CTR) training in Ebeye.

Life Foundation also sponsored Dr. Zacharias, the HIV clinical physician from the capital Majuro, to co-train with our Pacific trainer. Ten counsel-

ors and testers graduated from the four-day training. Ebeye Hospital staff were extremely touched by Life Foundation's donation of office supplies, condom supplies and commitment to hold the training in this highly underserved island community.

Life Foundation also conducted this training in Guam earlier this year with 14 graduates from four different Pacific Island jurisdictions.

## NATIONAL HIV TESTING DAY

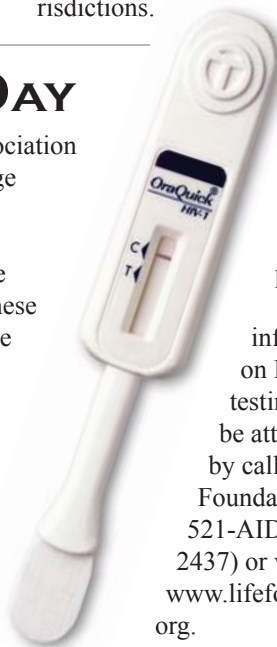
Life Foundation recognized the 12th annual National HIV Testing Day on Friday, June 27th. This year, Mayor Mufi Hannemann joined the Mayor's Campaign Against HIV by issuing a proclamation on the importance of National HIV Testing Day, which was presented to Life Foundation. He joins 55 other mayors across the United States in this campaign. His involvement in the 2008 Mayor's Campaign allowed Life Foundation to receive 300 free HIV tests from Orasure and the National Association of People with AIDS.

National HIV Testing Day

was created by the National Association of People with AIDS to encourage awareness and testing.

Approximately 40,000 new infections occur every year in the United States, and over half of these occur in individuals under the age of 25. In Hawaii, it is estimated that there are approximately 3,000 people living with HIV/AIDS.

Life Foundation offers free and anonymous HIV testing year round, with results in 20 minutes, at its offices located at 677 Ala Moana Blvd., Suite 226, and in remote locations such as public parks or private homes. Walk-in tests are welcome Monday through Friday,
